Well dang. I took quite a few shots of the show and tell items, but didn't put them online. Now I'm in France.

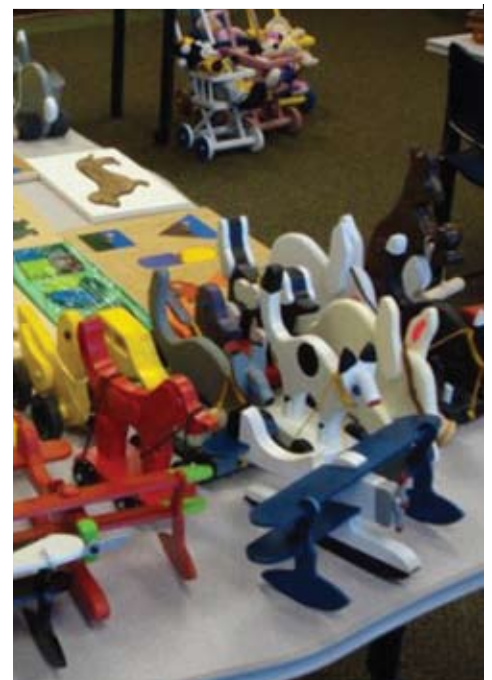
